Faith Lutheran Church Council Minutes - Unapproved October 18, 2022

Council members present: Nancy Hendry, Doug Halvorson, Sue Temte, Karen Gabriel, Rose Marie Nutt, Diane Gibas, Pr. Josh Blair, Holly Main, and Craig Lemieux via zoom. Council members absent, Derek Karels, Shari Strecker and Brianna Heise.

The meeting was called to order by council president Craig Lemieux at 6:02 p.m.

Pr. Josh Blair gave devotions from John 21.

The agenda was approved with modifications by a motion from Nancy, seconded by Rose Marie.

Doug made the motion to approve minutes of the September meeting as well as a special meeting and the council meeting following the annual meeting on September 25. Sue seconded the motion and it passed. Corrections were made to the minutes submitted for the annual meeting. The minutes will have to be approved at the next annual meeting.

The September treasurer's report was received. The cost of the furnace of \$11,703.69 has been paid, and the electricians have been paid for their work. Sue made the motion to accept the report, Rose Marie seconded the motion, and it passed.

Pr Josh gave his report. He made seven visits, one funeral, one burial, attended the fall theological gathering, attended and led a session at Walking Together a Northeast Synod event held in Cloquet. Four members attended with him. He met with the Isle Ministerium; third graders were given their Bibles. He reported Faith in Action has about 20 kids attending. The largest group is fourth through sixth grade boys. He joined the quilters and learned to quilt one Wednesday. He attended a power and boundaries training with is required for pastors. Attended confirmation in Moose Lake, a rural volunteer potluck. He said the lock-up went well. Twenty-one kids had signed up for the youth gathering at the time of the council meeting. He said there was concern that FIA ran too late for younger children. He suggested possibly starting at 5 p.m. for the younger children having supper with the older kids and then letting the young ones go home. Pastor said the insurance has been transferred, and the meal train for Jim Beck is going well. He applied for rebates for all the upgrades for the lights, etc. He attended most committee meetings. His goal is to attend all committee meetings when possible. On a personal note, he has finished another class, the second portion of his doctoral thesis. He will get a break of two weeks have another eight-week class, then graduate in the spring.

Old business:

The youth picked colors for the youth room. Some patching has to be completed. The project is moving forward, but there is an order to the project that has to be followed.

The personnel committee is working on updating the office hours, and job descriptions to determine what we need. This will be an ongoing item on the agenda for a while.

The flooring in the education area is an ongoing project. The carpet still needs to be removed. The question was raised regarding how the epoxy flooring would work for the dancers. Right now that is on hold until the painting can get done.

An estimate has to be received from the electricians for lights, and the sanctuary wall.

The switch to the new insurance company was effective Oct. 1.

Council is looking for some solutions to some issues. We also discussed busy bags. We learned the bags are in need of updating. Doug will apply for a \$250 Thrivent grant to cover the cost.

Our corporate resolution was updated as required by law. The agents of Faith include: Craig Lemieux, president; Sue Temte, vice president; Doug Halvorson, treasurer; Diane Gibas, secretary; and Craig Magnan, financial secretary. Sue made the motion to accept this resolution, Doug seconded and the motion passed.

Six students are in line to be confirmed this year. Holly and Karen volunteered to interview the candidates.

Two people have expressed interest in becoming members of Faith. Doug made the motion and Karen seconded the motion to accept two new members.

Kristi and Pastor Josh gave the dates they would like to have vacation days. It was agreed to let Pastor rollover a couple of his days for his graduation. Sue made the motion and Karen seconded to approve the dates and the rollover.

The janitorial position was discussed.

Getting the website updated has been a matter of discussion. Craig has talked to Danielle George about getting the work done. She will give us a bid on how much it will cost. Craig will invite her to the next council meeting to to talk to us. Nancy made the motion and Sue seconded the motion to authorize \$160 to cover the cost of making a plan for us to look at. The motion passed.

Doug made the motion to authorize the signature card for the bank, Sue seconded the motion and it passed.

The updated church council needs to be included in the update for the church directory. New council members are Holly Main, Brianna Heise and Karen Gabriel.

Ministry team reports

The connect committee is planning an Advent Festival again this year.

It was requested to combine the Stewardship and Finance committees in the directory. Nancy made the motion and Sue seconded it. The motion passed.

The next meeting will be held Nov. 15 at 6 p.m. Pr. Josh will have devotions again.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 p.m. with a motion by Diane, seconded by Pr. Josh.

The meeting was adjourned.






