December 16th, 2024

- **Call to Order** at 6:09pm
- **Devotions**
 - Karen
- **Guests**
 - Carolyn Nutt asked where the council was at with the topic of employees serving on council. She expresses that this decision made by council goes against the constitution. However, the council voted to have it added to our personnel policy. The concern is that this decision should be voted on by the congregation, not the council. Council expressed that the recommendation to add it to our personnel policy was made by the Synod. Council will discuss how we want to move forward with this later on in the meeting.
- **Agenda – Modifications and Approval**
 - Motion to approve – Diane, Second – Aleisha
- **Approval of Minutes from Council Meeting on November 19th, 2024**
 - Tara brought up a possible modification; however, after much discussion, Diane made a motion to approve, Second — Elaine.
 - 9 members — in favor of the approval, 1 member — opposed
- **Receive Treasurer's Report**
 - We are a quarter of the way through the fiscal year already. A couple items to be concerned about are kitchen supplies and pulpit supplies. These are categorized as at risk already so we will need to keep an eye on them. The social media/communications/website salary is also considered at risk. It was noticed that the salary number may have been off in October as it saw a substantial increase. Tara is going to look into this further to try and get an answer.

- **Pastor's Report**

- **Old Business:**
 1. Pizza w/ Pastors
 - We looked at where we are going to pull funding from for Pizza w/ Pastors. We decided that for this year we will pull it out of Connect because Connect has a bigger budget currently. Next year we will change the budge to reflect Pizza w/ Pastors, and it will come from Local & Global.
 - They had a great turnout for the first get together. Concerns were expressed that it was just a chance for students to eat pizza. This is not

the case and good conversation was had. There are a few different churches taking part in this including Faith Lutheran Church, Isle Baptist Church, Isle Evangelical Free Church, and Wahkon Presbyterian Church. We are in the early stages of getting it up and running so watch for more on this.

3. Personnel Policy & Employees

- Council will engage the congregation in conversation and educational opportunities around the issue of employees on council which will be voted on at a later date.

4. Young Adults Funding

- We are getting funding from the ELCA for the young adults group. The grant is \$5,000. Young adults is a target area for the ELCA. Faith's young adult group is now an official gather site for the ELCA. This means our young adults group is being advertised by the ELCA as a group where young adults from all over can come and be apart of us. Pastor Josh, Colby Hubbel and the program director from Camp Onamia are co-leading together.

• **New Business**

1. Parking Lot

- Our parking lot needs to be repaired as it is very uneven and a fall risk. The concern is that we cannot just get it repaved. It needs structural work underneath the pavement so that it doesn't continue to be an issue again in future years. We do have funds available for this.
- Kortney made the motion to approve that we start getting bids to repair the parking lot, Second – Elaine.

2. Parking Lot Light - Quotes

- We received a bid for \$1,230 from Live Wire Electrical Services in Isanti. We are calling a few more people for quotes and will look at them next month. Aliesha will contact two companies.

3. App for Faith

- We are looking into a cell phone app for Faith because one of the challenges that we have is getting information out to those who don't check their email, etc. The app would allow us to send push notifications to people's phones from the app when we need to communicate with them. Examples include- getting information about youth group stuff to parents, prayer requests, being able to watch Sunday services live, a place for people to see events Faith is hosting, and Faith could start daily devotionals that would be right on the app. Darin Stenvold has said he can get the app created for us for \$500. This is a significant discount as the price is normally \$2,500. It would be \$49 a month to keep the app

updated. This would happen as do all your current apps on your phone. There are fees to publish on the app store, however we are non-profit so these fees would not apply to us. Council decided that we would like Darin to come in and answer any questions we may have.

4. Tim McArdle has asked to resign from council. Nancy moves to accept that we accept his resignation, Second - Doc. We thank him for his time and wish him luck.

- Local & Global Missions – The ELCA giving tree is up and we did gifts for the schools giving tree. The church filled 15 tags for the school. We are looking at introducing the YAGM team to the congregation soon. The Reconciling in Christ retreat is at Faith on January 25th. This is welcoming LGBTQIA+. This is a retreat put on by the Synod, and Faith is hosting it this year. A couple people expressed comments and said was a good experience.
- Children, Youth, Family, & Education – Advent fest was a good time. The Christmas program is December 18th with a lasagna dinner before hand to support the youth. Lots of fundraising for the mission trip is happening.
- Stewardship & Finance – See treasurers report. A new procedure was put together for donor numbers. Please speak with Aliesha, Kristi, Dale or Pastor if you have questions regarding this.
- Building, Property, & Cemetery – It was found that we have no smoke or carbon monoxide detectors in the church. This is being worked on.

"No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape." 1 Corinthians 10:13

As each new year arrives, many of us like to make resolutions to either continue a good practice, to change an undesired trait, to improve a bad behavior, or to accomplish a personal goal. However, as the year progresses, many of those resolutions made in good faith, end up broken. Perhaps it is because of our busyness, forgetfulness, or we just find it too difficult to accomplish the resolution that we made.
