Faith Lutheran Church Council Unapproved Minutes August 15, 2023

Members present: Karen Gabriel, Nancy Hendry, Shari Strecker, Sue Temte, Pr. Josh Blair, Rose Marie Nutt, Doug Halvorson, Diane Gibas and Craig Lemieux via zoom. Members Absent: Briana Heise, Holly Main, Derek Karels.

The meeting was called to order by President Craig Lemieux via zoom at 6:05 p.m.

Karen Gabriel gave devotion.

The secretary's report was received and after a correction that the July meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. The report was accepted after a motion by Nancy Hendry, seconded by Doug Halvorson.

The treasurer's report was given. Doug Halvorson said our finances are very good. Giving has been strong in both the general and special offerings. He stated we have a very generous congregation. Shari Strecker made the motion to accept the treasurer's report, Rose Marie Nutt seconded the motion. The report was approved.

In his report, Pr. Josh stated VBS was a success this year. Emily Miller did a great job as coordinator. The number of children attending did vary with a low in the 10s to a high in the 40s.

Pastor has made plans for the coming year for curriculum for Faith in Action and confirmation as well as scheduling for those areas.

In the past month he had one funeral and visited homebound members. He has two weddings in September and a planning meeting for the R.U.R.A.L. event coming up.

New member Sunday is scheduled for September 17. As of the council meeting date, he had 15 prospective members scheduled to join Faith.

Pastor Josh was invited to join a Holy Land pilgrimage for pastors in January, from Jan. 2 to Jan. 15. He would like to use his continuing education funds for the trip. He is allotted \$1,000 a year. Shari Strecker made a motion to allow this use of funds, seconded by Nancy Hendry. The motion passed.

Pastor Josh will be meeting with youth and parents to discuss future mission trips. Nancy Hendry stated they may be interested in looking at a schedule of every other year for a more local trip and a longer trip. A local trip could involve as little as two days of service. The youth and parents will discuss ideas of service and fund-raising activities. This is an ongoing project, and more information will be forthcoming.

Under old business:

The personnel committee has been named. Aliesha Holbert and David Miller will join President Craig Lemieux, Vice President Sue Temte and Pr. Josh on the committee.

In an update on the north wing renovation, painting has been done, the old carpet was removed, Donna Pinz agreed to make the window coverings needed and Pr. Josh found a site to order new signs. The signs will cost \$9.75 each and will match our existing signs. Rose Marie Nutt made the motion to purchase the signs, seconded by Doug Halvorson. The motion passed. Kudos were expressed for the organizing projects and work Doug and his wife Judy did on the north wing renovation.

Council member terms which are expiring were discussed. The positions will be given to the nominating committee to seek people willing to serve on council.

The second office position was discussed. Doug Halvorson made the motion, seconded by Nancy Hendry to keep the position. How we proceed will be looked at in our next meeting in September.

Annual reports are due in the office no later than Aug. 30, 2023.

Doug Halvorson asked for input on the coming budget from council members. He gave out rough drafts of where he would like information. We are to return our suggestions to him by Sunday, Aug. 20.

Committee reports:

Nancy Hendry said the worship and music committee met and developed a schedule for the coming year. Diane Gibas said the prayer team met and they are working on ideas to spice up your prayer life. Donna Pinz has made additional prayer pillows and prayers have been sent to give to youth when they are here for church, Faith in Action, confirmation or whenever they are present at Faith.

Sue Temte said the connect committee is focused on Rally Sunday and the potluck dinner at this time.

The next regular meeting will be held one week early because of business for the annual meeting. We will meet Sept. 12 at 6 p.m.

"Personal Prayer"

Need of personal prayer: Seek prayer during communion on Sunday's or contact any prayer team member who will pray with you.



Looking for ways to spice up your prayer life? Let your breathing support your praying.

Without any words, take time to focus on your breathing. Notice the rhythm of your breathing and how it just happens on its own. This is God letting you know through your breathing, that he is with you at all times.

Now with words, try breathing through your prayers? They are called breath prayers, and can be either Bible verses or short statements that coincide with your breathing. This allows you to be in God's presence anywhere and at any time...while asking for his strength and wisdom throughout the day. Your breathing is your continual connection with God.

To begin a breath prayer, focus your heart and mind on God. Then say a few short words of your prayer as you inhale and a few words as you exhale. Continue in this manner until your prayer has been said. Or, say a Bible verse, breathing in and out at the end of the verse. Repeat that same verse over and over again, each time removing one phrase from the end until only one phrase or word remains. Then, work your way back to the full verse. Always, remembering to breath in and out at the end of each line that is said.

Breath prayers are easy and can be personalized in many ways. And, they can be done while waking, doing tasks, or just relaxing. During the month of September, there will be guides available to help you with your Breath Prayers.



We welcome you.


Rehearsals are from 5 pm to 6 pm most Sundays.
