Faith Lutheran Church Council Minutes (Unapproved) November 14, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by council vice president Derek Karels.

Devotions were given by Sue Temte.

Doc made the motion, seconded by Rose Marie to approve the agenda.

The secretary's report from the Oct 17 mtg was approved after a motion by Doc, seconded by Rose Marie.

The council treasurer, Aliesha Holbert gave the treasurer's report. She has some questions she is still seeking answers for and will report back next month. Doc made the motion to accept the treasure's report as given, seconded by Nancy. The report was accepted.

In his report, Pastor Josh said Advent and Christmas services are planned. On Dec. 4 at 6:30 p.m., the synod has requested use of the Faith Church building for a meeting for the welcome/reconciliation series they are holding. The church does not need to provide anything but the building. He officiated over two funerals and one baptism. The youth day of service was a success. He met with worship teams. Attended a conference meeting. Had a meeting with the bishop and staff for candidacy meeting. Met with Pastor Ben from Yagam ministry regarding a mission team for Faith to help sponsor. Met with Faith in Action, youth groups and Bible study. Attended the confirmation dinner. Met with mentor pastor. Attended volleyball and football games in support of youth. Visited homebound members. Sent cards to visitors who filled out connect cards. His trip to the Holy land has been changed to Greece and Italy. The dates will be the same. The focus will be following the footsteps of Paul. He asked the council's permission to still attend the tour. Council agreed. Pastor will also take his last vacation days of this year December 25 through Jan. 1. He also shared what he has been reading as ongoing education.

Old Business:

The door in the north wing got fixed. There is a problem with a breaker. Waiting for an electrician to come and check it out.

Forms were available for Faith accounts at First National Bank of Milaca to change names.

For Spice up Your Prayer Life activity in November they have a large frame for the church and ribbons cut for people to write their prayers on and weave them in the frame. There are also small frames available for people to take home and make their own personal prayer weaving. Bereavement follow up was discussed. The next meeting will be Dec. 12 at 10 a.m.

The children, youth, family, and education committee will hold a lasagna dinner before the Christmas program on Wed. Dec. 20. This will be a youth fundraiser.

The building, property and cemetery committee has gotten building issues taken care of except the electrical problem with the breaker, but that is in the works.

The new technology committee has met and is looking for people who are willing to help with the sound booth.

The next meeting will be held on the second Tuesday, Dec. 12 at 6 p.m. Doc will give devotions.

Craig made the motion, seconded by Sue to adjourn the meeting.

Spice up your Prayer Life... Advent - a month of guided prayer

Advent is a time to quiet our hearts and to set aside time to worship Jesus, especially during the busy and hectic holiday season. Today, we have both an Advent calendar and the Advent wreath to help us focus our days while we wait the coming of the Christ Child. There is no right or wrong way to observe Advent as long as it is spent communicating to God with a sincere and open heart.

German Lutherans would mark the days leading up to Christmas by making chalk marks on walls or doors, lighting candles or placing straws in a Nativity crib. Then in the 19th century, the Advent calendar was created to do the same by adding some sort of activity, with a prayer, quote or scripture verse each day.

The Advent wreath with its twinkling lights and candles came into being hundreds of years ago in Lutheran Germany to represent Jesus as the light that came to overcome the darkness of this world. wreaths are usually circular, to represent God's infinite love, and are made of evergreen bows, which represent the hope of eternal life brought by Jesus. There are 4 candles around the wreath that are either colored or white, to represent the 4 weeks of Advent and symbolizes the Christian concepts of hope, peace, joy and love. The candles are lit successively each week, usually on Sundays during the Advent season. Inside the wreath is a larger white candle which symbolizes the arrival of Christmas and is known as the "Christ Candle". This candle is lit on Christmas Eve and again each day throughout the 12 days of Christmas. Along with the lighting of each candle, there are readings and prayers. The beauty of this tradition is that you can do what works best for you and your family. The lighting of the candles, the readings and prayers, all help remind us that the Christmas season is first and foremost about Jesus.

At the Advent Festival on December 3, there will be Advent calendars as well as supplies to make your own Advent wreath. Also available will be Advent scripture readings and prayers.

May your lives this Christmas be filled with hope, peace, joy and love as you await the arrival of the Christ child.
